



GETTING PRODUCTION READY FOR AUGUST

The new Illinois State University student information system is scheduled for migration into production during the month of August. Once the migration is complete, the Admissions process will be available online to students registering for the fall of 2015. This includes applying online; paying application fees and enrollment deposits; and viewing the application status and required information to complete the application process. During the migration, the campus community will be updated by email and Tech Alerts.

IAM July 2014 Roll-Out

The anticipated roll-out for Oracle's Identity and Access Management Tool (IAM) is in July.

What does this mean?

Most of the IAM work is behind the scenes involving revamping of the technical identity infrastructure and identity flow preparing for new functionality in the future. There will be a new website for self-registration and University Login ID (ULID) activation.

How will it affect me?

With the new system, changes will be made regarding permanency of a ULID. Currently, if a student or employee is assigned a ULID, then leaves the University and returns, it is possible a new ULID will be assigned. The identity experience will be much smoother since the ULID they are given will be used throughout their entire affiliation with ISU. If someone leaves the University and returns a few years later, they will use the same ULID as in the past.



Testing and Training Happening in July

Prior to the August release, testing and training will be completed for the new enterprise applications. Those involved in the testing process include quality assurance, project team members and end users. The testing phase will help validate the conversion data and configuration for the new system. It will also allow opportunities for users to become familiar with the system. Testing is scheduled to begin on July 1 and last most of July.

Training is another integral part of the implementation process. Several levels and types of training are required and will be scheduled throughout the implementation period. Admissions training will begin the week of July 14. Training for CRM and 3Cs (Communications, Checklists and Comments) will be held the end of July and beginning of August. Dates for other products will follow.

Director of Application Services Badri Rajagopalan gave a status update on the Oracle Identity and Access Management Suite and Beth Ladd, Director of Business Intelligence, presented on setup of IBM Cognos for the Business Intelligence Tool. University Registrar Jess Ray hosted a panel discussion with functional members Ann Flaherty from Admissions, Bob Dennis from Student Records and Bridget Curl from Financial Aid. Technical Analyst Rachel Hart demonstrated PeopleSoft Campus Solutions and the meeting wrapped up with a question and answer session.
